

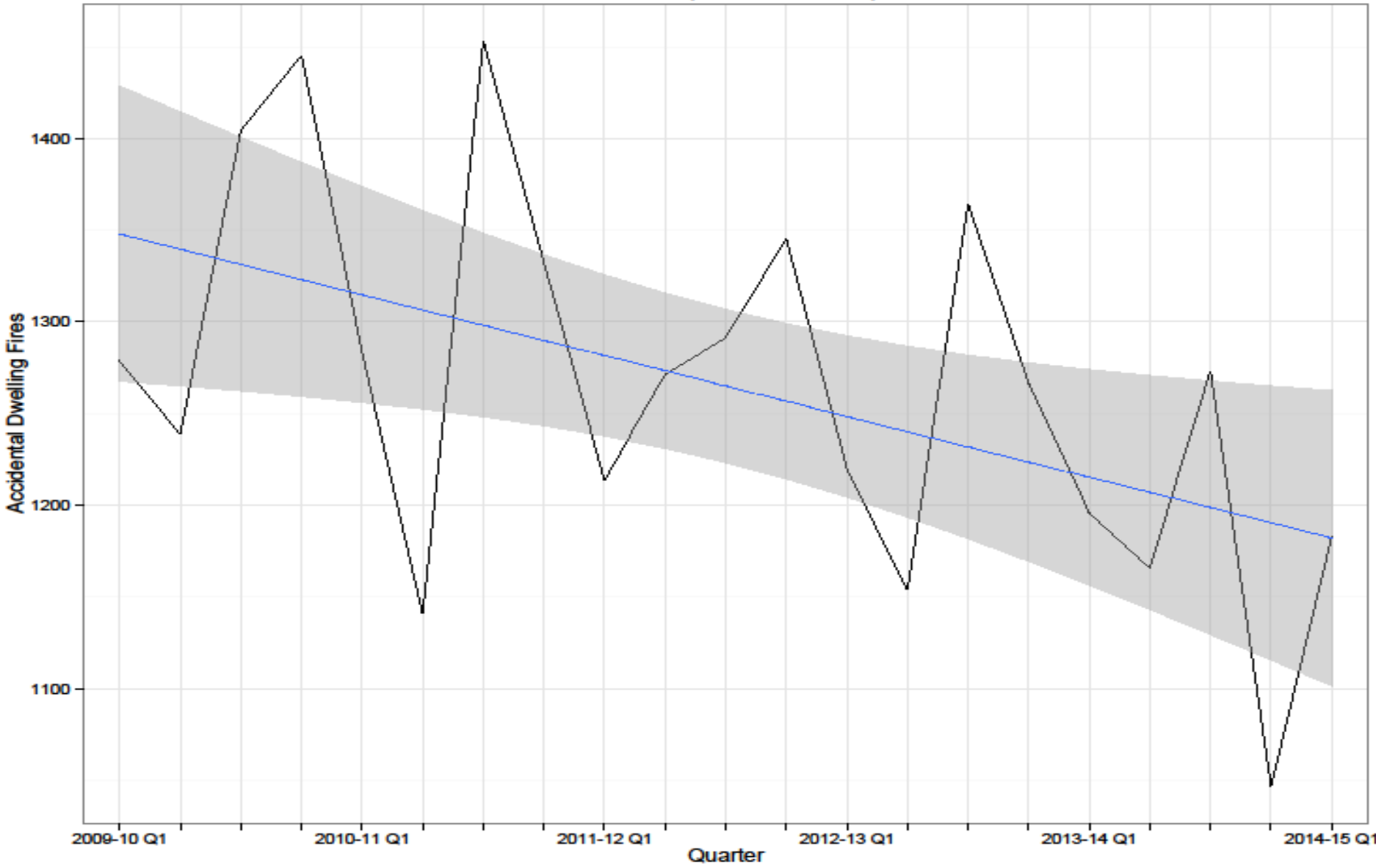

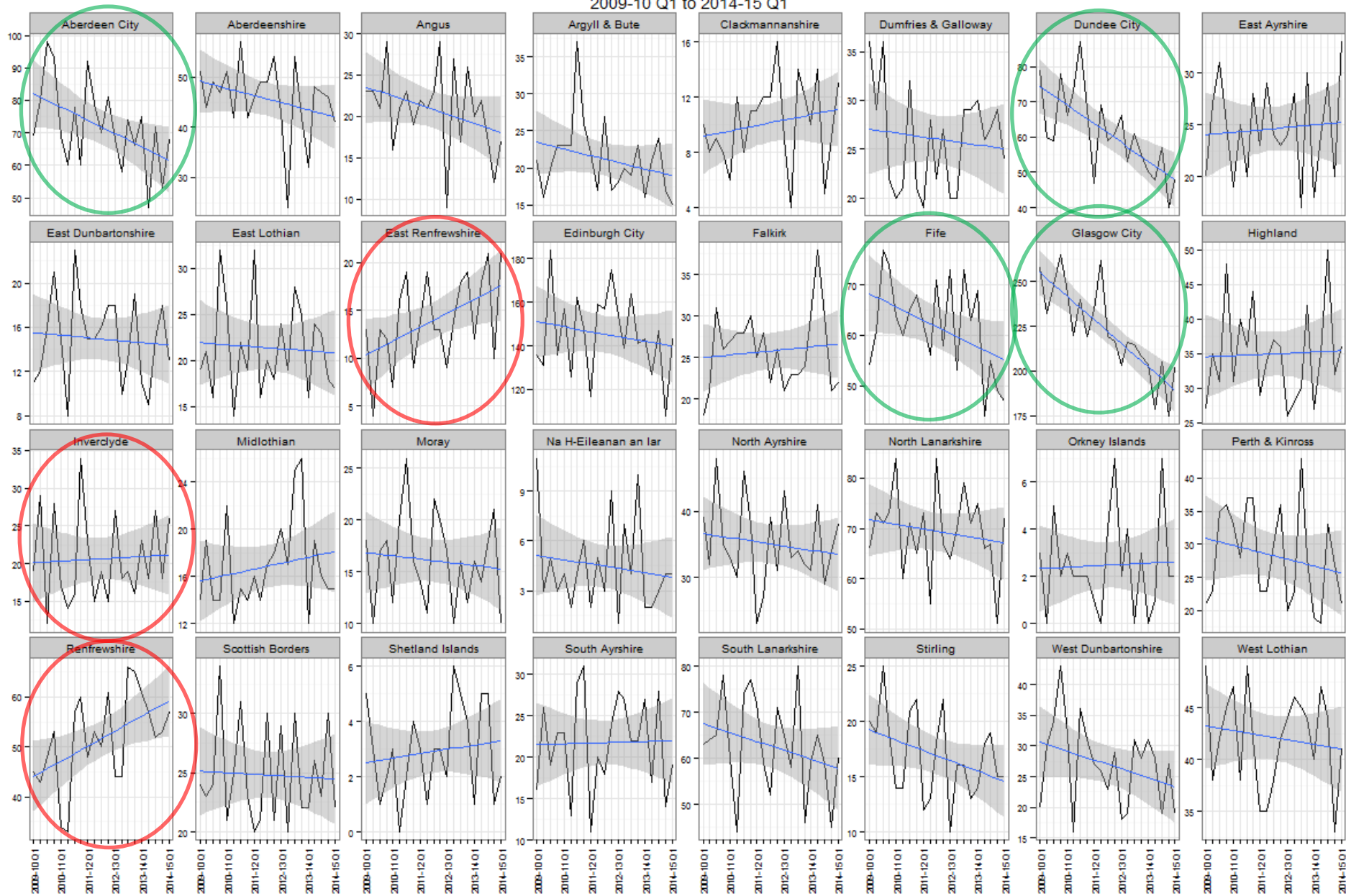

2009-10 Q1 to 2014-15 Q1



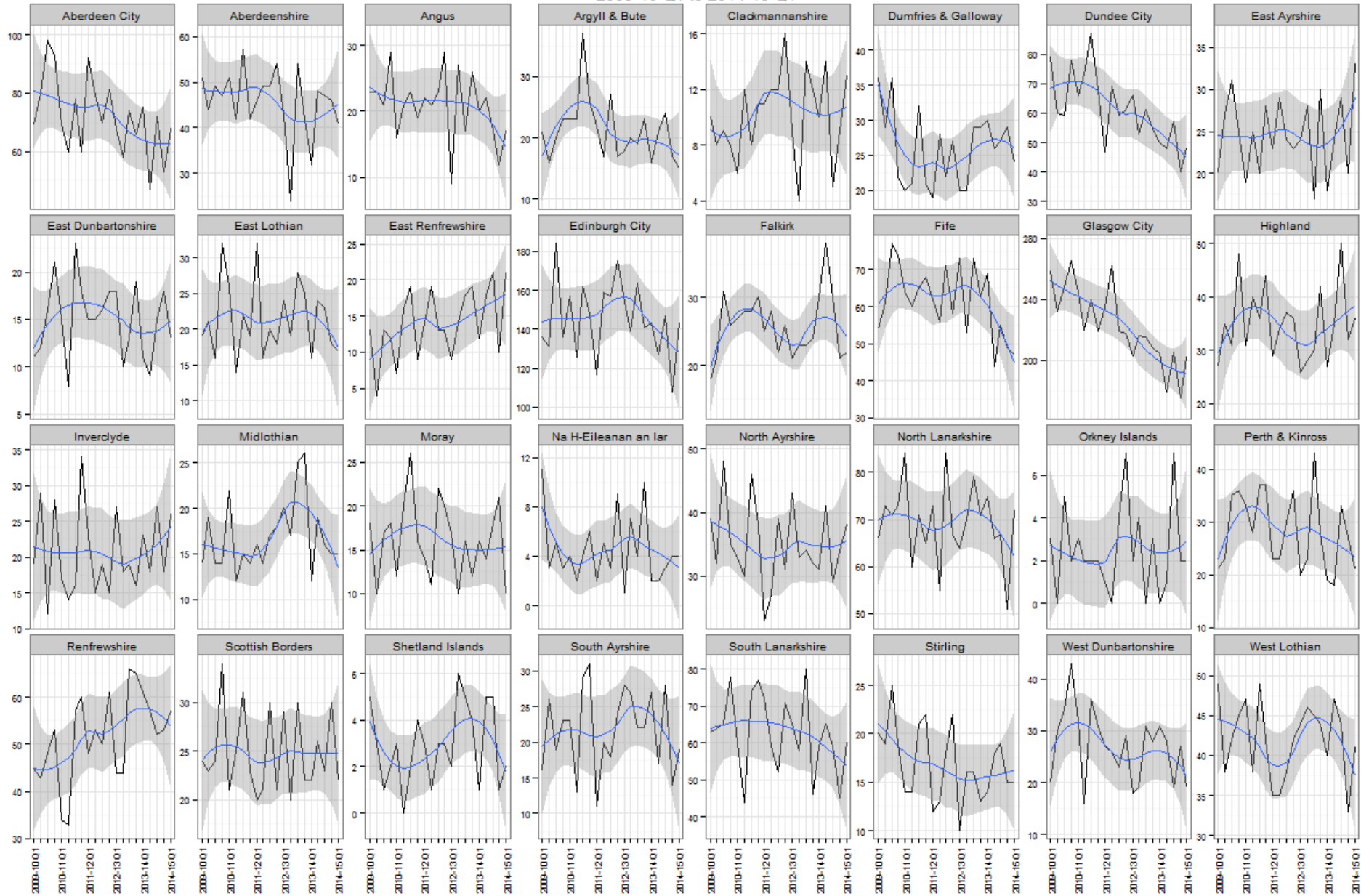
By Local Authority

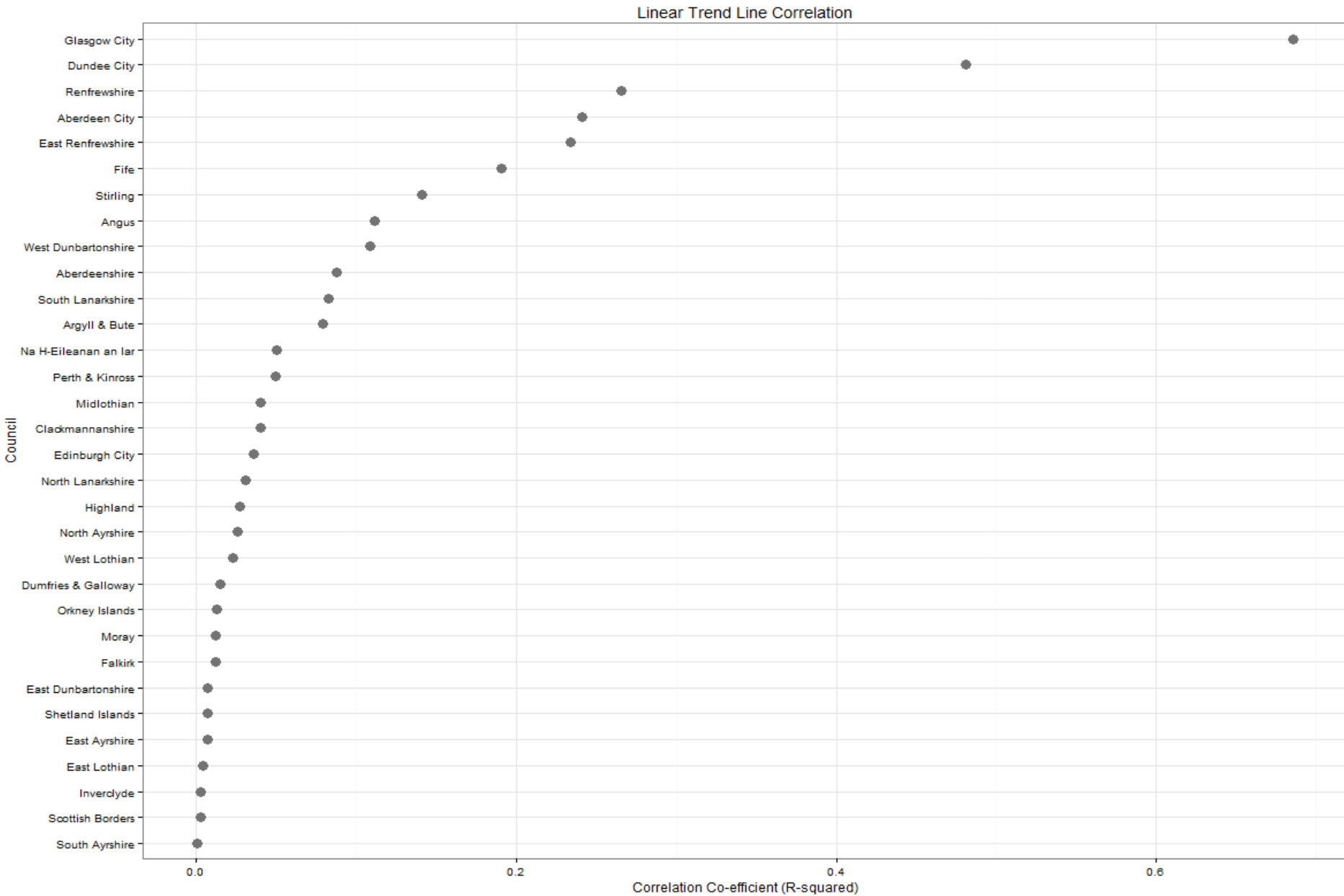

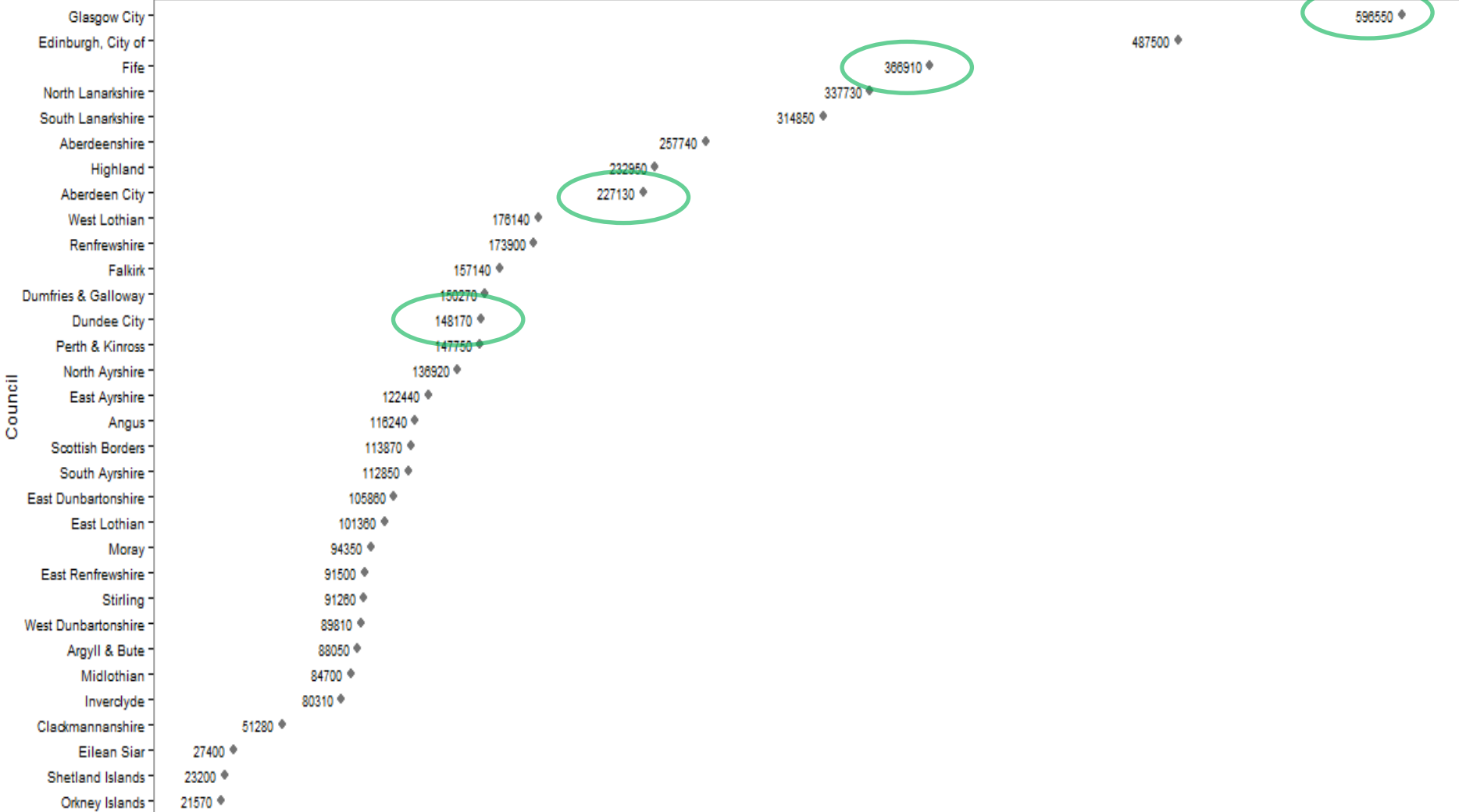

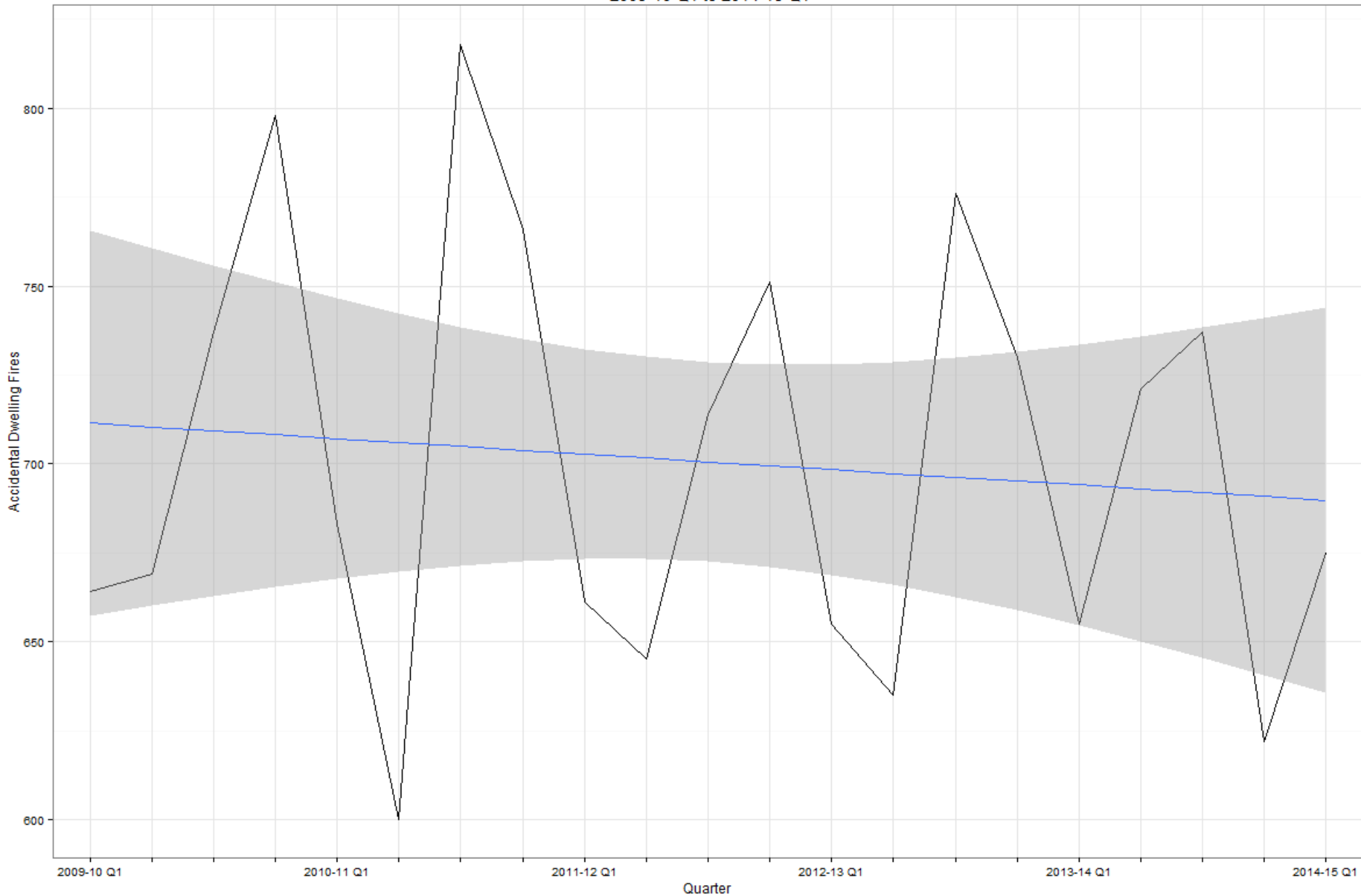
Population Ranked

Population Estimates 2013



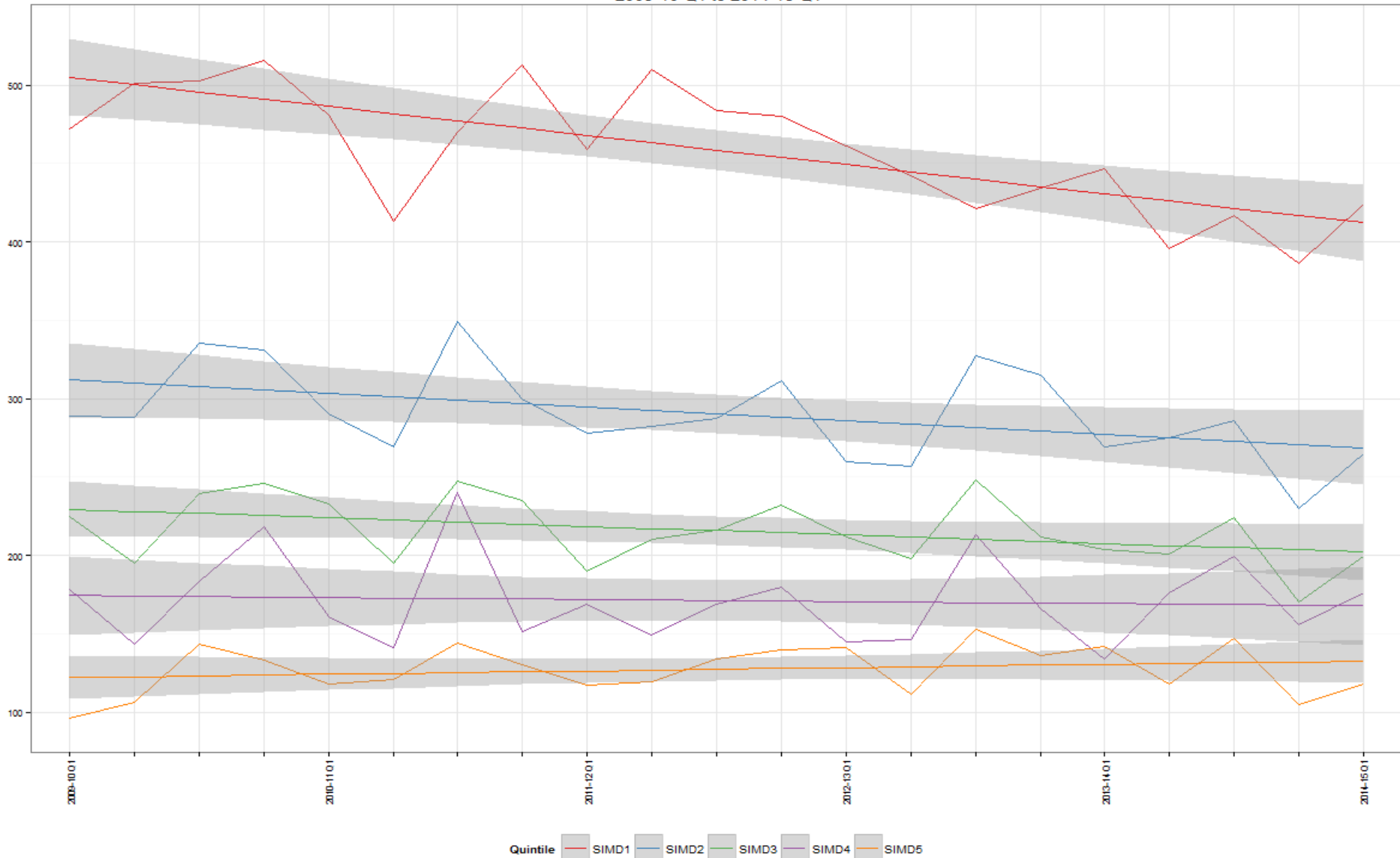

2009-10 Q1 to 2014-15 Q1



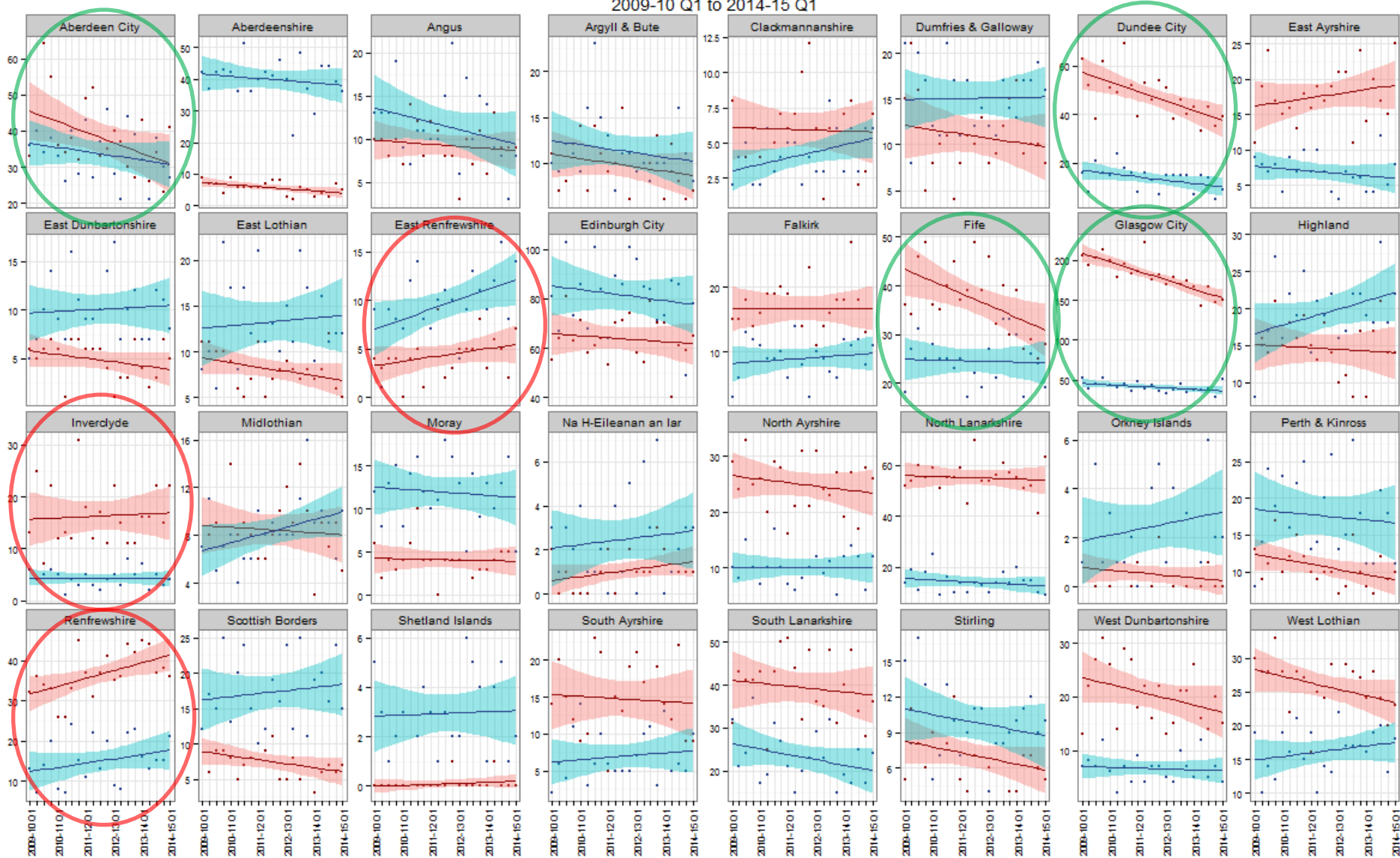
All-Scotland by SIMD Quintile

Conclusions

- Reductions in ADFs in Scotland in past five years are in the main from four main local authority areas out of 32
- Reductions are correlated with areas in lowest 40% of the SIMD
- In general, no reduction at all in areas in top 40% of SIMD
